10. Tarland Wetlands

- I. Tarland Burn the consultants are modelling the detailed design for full restoration; there will be further community engagement at the end of June. This will be held over multiple days at the Tarland Tearoom. (Additional funding will be required for the later phase of the project)
- II. Viewfield Wetland the new sign on the functioning of the wetland has been produced and will be erected by MRT; the ponds will be dug out again in the autumn.
- III. Gellan Wetland no update.
- IV. WWTW Wetland David Currie has made a new sign; it is the estate's responsibility to plug and unplug the pipe; the topping has been done; Scottish Water are proving very difficult to get hold of!
- V. Ordie Wetland a new scrape has been dug by MRT and there is a camera trap on it.

11. Paths and Access

Liz Cooper (LzC)is standing down as a Trustee but is remaining a member. The Trustees acknowledged LzC's contribution and her continued support, specifically her offer to continue to

- distribute paths' brochures to venues in the area
- provide admin support with Ruth Crawford, for the Tarland Paths fb page
- help with the visit from the Guides, taking them out on a maintenance walk
- volunteer (as Tarland Paths rep on Marr Paths Forum) to help man the MPF stall at Aboyne Games
- continue to do informal pruning with the "Tarland Tramps" Group

Gillian Needham has agreed to continue as a Tarland Paths rep on MPF, meeting with other paths groups by zoom every quarter, until a new trustee is found

LzC also shared a concern from the last MPF meeting, where a Lumphanan farmer refused maintenance on paths across his land, due to the incident at Petts Farm.

Action. LzC to arrange handover of admin and equipment. CR has suggested equipment could be stored on Tarland Trails.

Other. We received a request to work on the Coull stretch of the Tarland Way, as it has become very overgrown and narrow.

Action CR to obtain quote from gardener to cut back edges, but rewidening the path may need to be considered in future.

12. Tarland Bee Group - Update by YD

May and June are exceptionally busy for beekeepers and we give advice by email, text and phone call. When things are particularly complex, we have been on home visits.

We had heavy losses at the lease hive apiary with a number of queens which had failed to mate well enough last year and were drone layers this spring. This loss seemed a very difficult start to the year however, it has been a great learning experience. We have managed to get back on track with all colonies now viable. This has involved a lot of team work to help each other out, making nucs and bringing on queens. Well done everyone.

Dave Croll had his SBA Basic Beekeeper exam in May and passed with flying colours. Well done to Dave.

The beginner's class is well underway with lectures and hands on teaching. When this class is finished in a couple of weeks, we will have open hive sessions for our members.

We had a tidy up and sort out at the lease hive apiary, fixing gutters, adding water barrels, adding taps to them, sorting stands, etc. It was a lovely warm evening, and much was achieved. We were rewarded for our efforts with fresh donuts. Thanks to all our volunteers.

Other - Parking issues resolved. New car parking map to be issued by DM for Bee and Apple Juice Group.

13. Lego Club

Lego club continues to be a success, with 61 attendees in May and a record 80 attendees in June. Families from Strathdon, Logie Coldestone, Tarland, Lumphanan and Aboyne all attend. An application to the Marr Area has been made for additional funding to purchase more Lego sets, provide snacks and drinks, all whilst ensuring the club remains free to attend.
